

Policy overview

- Brings the Charter in to Policy
- Enables welfare views to influence operational decision making
- Provides detailed Policy information for PPASB services
- Ensures that welfare principles are applied in other policy areas (those not covered in detail within the document)



Aims and Objectives

- Eliminate unnecessary suffering to animals
- Protect the public from dangerous animals
- Assist partners in effectively supervising the animal population
- Protect the public from health impacts and/or nuisance caused by animals
