Objection to 11pm-1 am Licence Application for 1 St Paul's Lane, Lincoln LN1 3AX

My business is joined to 1 St Paul's Lane as their immediate neighbour.

I object on behalf of my clients who are neighbours to the serving of alcohol and music from 11pm to 1am in the morning in a residential area.

The Clients objecting are in St Pauls Lane, West Bight and Westgate.

The noise from people smoking outside the premises up to 1am and the coming and going during these early hours of the morning will no doubt cause a PUBLIC NUISANCE, as it has in the past (During staff/Christmas parties).

The noise currently from these premises is plenty (I regularly get complaints from clients), but as it's within the normal licensing hours 10am to 11pm it has to be tolerated by all of us neighbours, but past this time is unacceptable.

Most of this area along Westgate is residential and inappropriate for nightclub type activities. I would ask the decision makers if they would like live music and drinking until 1am within 30 meters of their front door? This level of noise at 1am in a residential area is A PUBLIC NUISANCE.

I would suggest the applicant stick to the regular licensing hours of 10am to 11pm as a compromise.
